Tip: When we think the answer to a question will be yes, we often use negative questions: *Didn't* we meet at Matt and Carol's wedding? (I think we did). We also use question tags: You're a lawyer, *aren't* you? (I think you are).

Live or where they are from, we ask Whereabouts?

A Where are you from, Natalia? B I'm from Spain.

A Oh, right. Whereabouts (in Spain)? B Valencia.

Ending conversations

A It was very nice to meet you. B You too.

A We should get together sometime B Yes, that's a good idea.

A Nice meeting you.

A See you later, maybe.

B You too.

• To respond to an apology we often use these phrases:

Oh, don't worry. Another time, maybe. Oh, dear. What happened? Oh, right. Why's that? We can also use No problem, to respond to an apology.

A I'm sorry, I can't come this evening. B No problem.

• There is often a pattern in this type of conversation: we apologize -* we give a reason -> we make a promise.
