Beware: This is not a complete lesson plan but a generic guide for "Premiere" and "Terminale" classes. You may substitute some words or expression to scaffold for your students. You may also want to divide it into two or three different lessons.

Topic:

Warm-up (3 mins)

Greet the students and ask them if they have written or told stories. Ask them how they structured it introduce the topic: Structure of a Paragraph.

Presentation (12 mins)

Explain to the students that in writing, it is important to organize our thoughts in a clear and concise manner.

Teach them/ have them learn the different parts of a paragraph. Give them the worksheet with the jumbled paragraph.

Show them the reordered paragraph and explain how it is now clearer and more organized. Show them the different parts of the paragraph.

Production (20 mins)

Ask the students to work in pairs and write a paragraph about why they want to learn English. Remind them to use the structure of a paragraph, including a topic sentence, main points, and a conclusion.

Monitor the students as they work and provide feedback as needed.

Once they have finished writing, ask a few students to share their paragraphs with the class. Provide constructive feedback and praise their efforts.

Closing (4 mins)

Review the different parts of a paragraph with the students (write it on the blackboard) or provide a printed summary of the lesson.

Encourage the students to practice writing using the structure of a paragraph.

Summary/Takeaway

This lesson is about the structure of a paragraph. The paragraph has three main parts:

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- A topic sentence.
- Main points,
- Concluding sentence.

The topic sentence tells the reader what the paragraph will be about.
